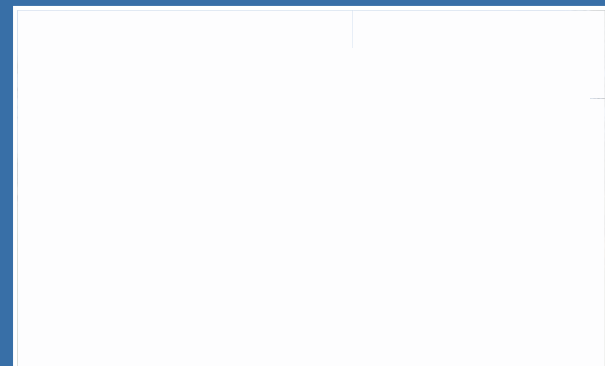

Dear Tourism Partners & Friends,


The Countdown is on! As of March 1, we were 100 days from the start of U.S. Open week (June 10-16) inside the Home of American Golf. The USGA estimates that we can expect approximately 250,000 people to attend the championship to be held at venerable Pinehurst No. 2 course, or folks that plan to be in the destination during the period. It is also estimated that the economic impact of the event will exceed \$200 million. That figure not only includes championship week, but also the residual impact of people visiting the Pinehurst area for subsequent months as they will be inspired given the exposure the U.S. Open will provide via network/global television and overall media coverage.

If you plan to attend the U.S. Open, we encourage you to purchase your tickets and lodging now! In 2014, up to 55,000 people per day attended the U.S. Open. This year, the USGA is planning to limit access to 35,000 fans, mostly so a better fan experience can be provided. Soon, there will be visible signs that something big is about to happen here. This month the hospitality compound, fan experiences and other championship infrastructure will start to take shape at Pinehurst No. 2. Pinehurst Resort has been busy with full renovations of the Carolina Hotel, the official opening of the Carolina Vista Lounge and prior

to the championship, the hall of history inside the clubhouse will be revealed. Our destination will be on the global stage and the Pinehurst, Southern Pines, Aberdeen Area will be ready to welcome everyone from near and far.

While the CVB is doing its part to promote the U.S. Open, you will soon see our "Open for the Open" campaign which will encourage championship patrons to enjoy the golf, but to also support our area businesses, shops, restaurants and attractions while they are here. We have a new destination distillery with BHAWK, and our newest brewery – The Buggy Factory – will be open in Carthage. The Seagrove pottery community is just a short drive away. And from Cameron to Vass to Southern Pines and Aberdeen, our quaint and friendly towns are ready to welcome everyone to explore and make memories during championship week.

This is an exciting time for the Home of American Golf!

Pinecone Pathways Hits Trails March 19

The popular Pinecone Pathways program is returning to Moore County and will run March 19-April 22. Due to the overwhelming popularity of the program, the CVB decided to make the scavenger hunt an annual event. Once again, the CVB has partnered with glassmakers at Starworks, in Star, to produce 100 glass pinecones to be hidden along trails throughout Moore County for a five-week period starting on the first day of spring and ending on Earth Day. The pinecones are actual size and will be tagged with a special number and QR code, so those finding them can register them and be eligible to win a prize including two ground passes for one day to attend the 2024 U.S. Open, among other prizes. 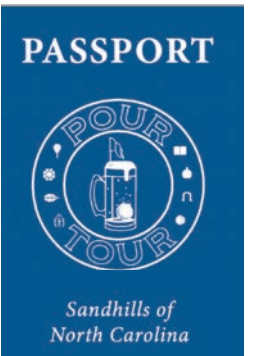


BHAWK Officially Opens Destination Distillery

U.S. Open Less Than 100 Days Away

The countdown is on for the 124th U.S. Open at Pinehurst Resort and the venerable No. 2 Course, June 10-16. March 1 marked 100 days to the start of championship week and the USGA is beginning the build out of the hospitality village and infrastructure needed to host the 35,000 daily spectators expected to attend the event. The USGA estimates that approximately 250,000 people will be in and around the Pinehurst area during championship week which translates to about a \$200 million economic impact to Moore County and the Sandhills region. Pinehurst No. 10 Opens April 3

Pinehurst No. 10 is the resort's first new course in nearly three decades. Tom Doak's new design features native wiregrass, sweeping landscape and rolling hills formed by geology. Midway through the course, it also takes advantage of rugged dunes carved out by mining operations around the turn of the 20th century. World Golf Hall of Fame Making Progress

As we approach the U.S. Open in June, construction on the rest of Golf House Pinehurst's campus is ongoing, specifically the second building which will house the USGA Welcome Center and World Golf Hall of Fame. While the opening date of the WGHOFF has not been announced, safe to say it will be open to visit this summer. The headline display area will be the locker room concept relocated from the facility's previous home in St. Augustine, Fla. Visitors will be able to access a mobile app on their phones and hear voiced footage from various inductees with stories about golfers and their personal artifacts on display. There will be approximately 4,000 pieces of memorabilia on display. More to come as we get closer to June!

Wee Pines at Olmsted Village Now Open

The much-anticipated Wee Pines at Olmsted Village miniature golf course is now open! The 36-hole course was designed by Miniature Golf Solutions, a company owned by father-and-son team David and Matt Bailey that has created custom indoor and outdoor courses across the country. Wee Pines will have clubs in all sizes to rent. The facility will not offer food or alcohol, but there will be soft drinks, ice cream and snacks available and picnic tables will be placed on a small patio behind the clubhouse. The lighted course will be open late for nighttime rounds. Wee Pines is located in Taylortown next to Harris Teeter.

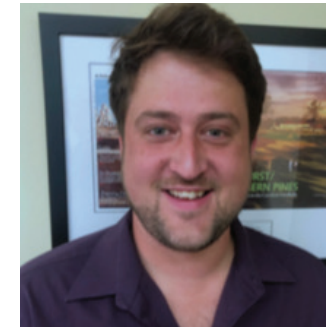
